


Overview of the enforcement of "Swissness" by the IPI*

- Paris Convention for the Protection of Intellectual Property of 20 March 1883 (Stockholm Act of 1967); in particular Articles 6ter and 10bis.
- Geneva Convention on the Amelioration of the Condition of the Wounded and Sick in Armed Forces in the Field of 12 August 1949; in particular Articles 38 and 53 para. 2.
- Geneva Convention of 12 August 1949 for the Amelioration of the Condition of Wounded, Sick and Shipwrecked Members of Armed Forces at Sea
- Madrid Agreement for the Repression of False or Deceptive Indications of Source of Goods of
 <u>14 April 1891</u>. This agreement was subject to various revisions, including 1925 in The Hague
 (the <u>Hague Act</u>), 1934 in London (the <u>London Act</u>) and 1958 in Lisbon (the <u>Lisbon Act</u>). On
 14 July 1967, an additional agreement was agreed upon in Stockholm (the <u>Additional Act of Stockholm</u>). For Switzerland, the version of the agreement which applies depends on the
 treaty text ratified by the country concerned. Particularly relevant are Articles 1 and 4.
